<b>U.S. Visa</b>	<p>If attending as a full-time student (enrolled in a minimum of 6 units), students will need to obtain an F-1 Student Visa to enter the United States. The I-20 Form is required in order to obtain an F-1 Student Visa. Students should allow enough time for I-20 and F-1 Student Visa processing.</p>		
<b>Health Insurance</b>	<p>All students are required to have health insurance. UCI Health Insurance covers students for the session they are enrolled in. The cost for Session I is \$250, 10-Week is \$420, Session II is \$250, and Session I and II is \$500.
